



## ITEMS TO CONSIDER WHILE USING THE ALBERTA'S IRON HORSE TRAIL

- ~ All motorized Off-Highway vehicles MUST be registered and insured.
  
  - ~ No one under the age of 14 years is permitted to operate an Off-Highway Vehicle on public roadways/trails or Crown land unless they are accompanied and under the direct supervision of an adult over the age of 18. (Who is occupying the passenger seat on the Off-Highway Vehicle or is in or on a vehicle that is traveling in close proximity to the Off-Highway Vehicle).
  
  - ~ Anything other than a stock muffler, or any device that increases the noise of an Off-Highway Vehicle, is illegal.
  
  - ~ As a general rule, the land adjacent to Alberta's Iron Horse Trail is privately owned and regardless of whether it is "Posted" or not, Off-Highway Vehicle Operators are not permitted to trespass without permission.
  
  - ~ Reckless, careless driving or driving without due consideration for others is considered Dangerous Driving under the Traffic Safety Act and carries a significant fine up to and including seizure of the Off-Highway Vehicle.
